OpenLMIS is a powerful, open source, cloud-based electronic logistics management information system (LMIS) purpose-built to manage health commodity supply chains. The OpenLMIS initiative seeks to improve supply chain efficacy in low resource communities to ensure that people—no matter where they live—have access to essential medicines and supplies when they need them.

Following initial deployments of the software beginning in 2013, OpenLMIS has proven to be an effective solution that is successfully running in seven geographies: Benin, Cote d'Ivoire, Malawi, Mozambique, Tanzania, Zambia, and Zanzibar.

Since the initial concept was developed, the OpenLMIS platform has become a multi-country, multi-donor open source community driven by a community of health and implementation partners. The OpenLMIS Community is committed to shared learning and shared benefit with the goal of continually improving the performance of health supply chains in low- and middle-income countries.

OpenLMIS features the [Principles for Digital Development](#) on its website, openlmis.org, demonstrating many of the key principles in its community practices and software development. The OpenLMIS Community looks forward to greater engagement with the Principles for Digital Development, and makes the following statement on behalf of the senior organizational leadership:
